Critical regionalism can be described neither as internationalism nor as an architectural expression of a region's history. It considers specific elements of certain buildings and interprets them from a reflective rather than an obvious point of view (Frampton, 2004). It pays more attention to a building's meaning than to its atmosphere, and the atmosphere would be appropriate if the architect's design had been traditional.

Conceptually, critical regionalism was a response to the cookie-cutter internationalism of modern architecture and the limitations of postmodernism. It argued for a specificity of site and context that didn't simply look back to the vernacular but rather created contemporary, unique regional forms.

In the postmodern debate within the field of architecture, an approach Kenneth Frampton has termed "critical regionalism" has attempted to counteract the dislocation and lack of meaning in modern architecture by using contextual forces to give a sense of place and meaning. 1 This has designated a new kind of regionalism in architecture, an attitude against international flows that function to standardize linguistic patterns and formal expressions throughout the West.

"Critical regionalism self-consciously seeks to deconstruct universal modernism in terms of values and images which are locally cultivated, while at the same time adulterating these autochthonous elements with paradigms drawn from alien sources." (Frampton, 1983) Critical Regionalism does not intend to revisit history or dwell in the past, but to find a middle ground between two extremes.
